





#### **AFRICA**

Angola: Conditions Adequate Despite Drought, Precarious in Some Districts


As of March 2007, despite drought conditions during the main 2005/06 agricultural season, the combination of surplus root and cereal crop production, adequate imports and healthy cross border trade have translated into generally adequate food availability throughout the country. Food security conditions are precarious in a number of districts in Uige, Zaire, Bengo, Benguela and Huambo provinces due to a poor 2005/06 harvest, diseases affecting cassava production and losses of nacas (lowland) crops due to intense

#### Oman, Iran, Pakistan: Gonu Expected to Affect Coastal Regions

As of 05 July, the predicted path of cyclonic storm Gonu has been revised. Gonu is now expected to affect the northern Oman coast as a category 4 storm, cross the Gulf of Oman and make landfall in Iran by 06 or 07 June as a category 2 system. Alerts have been issued for the Omani coast and south-eastern Iran, with south-western areas of Pakistan also likely to be affected.

#### Kenya: Hundreds Displaced by Flooding

As of 01 June, at least 500 people have been rendered homeless in Mombasa following a third day of heavy rains. More than 100 homes have been reported destroyed thus far in Kadongo, Moroto, Junda, Kadzonzo and Mushomoroni. Residents of swampy areas in the vicinity have been advised to seek refuge on higher ground. Transport routes to some areas are reportedly affected by floodwaters. This information could change as more reports become available.

#### Dominican Republic: Heavy Rains Bring Flooding

As of 31 May, heavy rain has flooded rivers and damaged farmland across the Dominican Republic and caused at least seven deaths, according to emergency officials. At least 4,000 homes have been affected, with thousands of people forced to evacuate due to landslides and rising floodwaters. Some 200 communities are reported to have been isolated following the destruction of bridges by swollen rivers. Rice, plantain and vegetable fields have been inundated in north and northeastern parts of the country. The Dominican Emergency Operations Center has declared a red alert in La Vega, Espaillat, Sanchez Ramirez and Duarte provinces. Maria Trinidad Sanchez, Puerto Plata, Santiago, Salcedo, Monte Cristi, Santo Domingo and Valverde Mao provinces are on yellow alert, while Monte Plata, Hato Mayor, Monsenor Nouel, Dajabon, Independencia, Samana, San Cristobal and San Jose de Ocoa are on green alert. The national meteorological service expects the heavy rainfall to continue at least until 01 June.

#### Central America: Tropical Depression Barbara Threatening Pacific Coast

As of 31 May, Tropical depression Barbara has formed off the Pacific coast of Mexico, and is expected to make landfall early next week, if it retains its integrity. The depression may become a tropical storm, and Mexican and Guatemalan Pacific costal areas have been advised to be alert for the possibility of high winds, precipitation and storm surge resulting from the system.


Colombia: Floods, Landslides and Possibility for New Volcanic Eruption□





#### SITUATION UPDATE 6 JUNE 2007



#### SITUATION LEVEL RAISED TO THREAT; AERIAL OPERATIONS REQUIRED IN YEMEN

The Desert Locust situation has become extremely serious in the interior of **Yemen** where substantial breeding has taken place because of unusually heavy rains. Hopper bands have formed over a large and remote area on the southern edge of the Empty Quarter. Swarms are expected to form in June and remain in the area and lay eggs by the end of the month. The eggs will hatch in July and another generation of hopper bands will form.

Consequently, aerial operations requiring external assistance will need to be mounted in July to avoid the formation of second generation swarms and to minimize the threat to crops and pasture.



## **HEWSweb phase II development has the following objectives:**

- Improve IASC coordination, prioritization, analysis, and decision-making processes by facilitating better sharing of IASC non-public early warning and emergency preparedness information, thereby ensuring that Early Warning leads to Early Action at the IASC interagency level.
- Continue to improve and **refine the usability**, value, and relevance of HEWSweb site to **enhance EW services** for the IASC and the international humanitarian community
- **Facilitate** and **support** inter-agency emergency preparedness and response (EPR) through information exchange, dissemination of knowledge, lessons learned and the development of competencies and capacities.
- Attract and retain highly involved and habitual uses from the IASC and the broader humanitarian community

## **Phase II outputs:**

- (a) development of an IASC password-protected page (including socio-political information/analysis)
- (b) consolidation and further development of the natural disaster section and functions
- (c) creation of an emergency preparedness and response content area
- (d) consolidation of technical and operational partnerships with specialised institutions and service providers

## **Challenges:**

- Improving linkages between EW and EA
- Incorporating new technology
- Sharing sensitive socio-political analysis
