(Trained under DIPECHO VI- 3 days training on CBDRR) took the leadership role for community mobilization and awareness building. Further, these trained youth would also facilitate the risk assessment, disaster risk reduction planning and implementation at the GN level. At the district level in consultation with the Zonal Education Director's Office, disaster management unit and the Government Agent Office, 40 schools each in Kilinochchi and Mannar were selected to provide one day training and orientation on the National Guideline on School Disaster Safety. More than 70 teachers participated from

both the districts. At the end of this orientation, schools have developed follow-up action plan to implement the guideline developed by Ministry of Education with National Institute of Education, Ministry of Disaster Management and DMC including organizing interactive sessions with students, essay and drawing competitions. Partners such as Save the Children, Oxfam Australia, Handicap International and Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ) GmbH have also joined hands to support this international event.
