Position: Child Centred Disaster Risk Reduction Adviser

General

Save the Children Denmark (SCD) fights for children's rights. We influence public opinion and support children at risk. Our vision is a world in which all children's rights are fulfilled – a world that respects and values each child, a world where all children participate and have influence, a world where all children have hope and opportunity.

Child Centred Disaster Risk Reduction (CCDRR) has been recently established by Save the Children Denmark in Somalia in response to the drought situation as well as other hazards the country is facing. Therefore, there are many opportunities about developing the role of children in DRR integrated programmes and include activities which also consider Climate Change Adaptation (CCA). The integrated programme also includes components on child resilience and education.

This position is likely to start in Nairobi and then be based in Puntland, Somalia

Responsibilities

S/he will have the responsibility for advising Save the Children Denmark's Disaster Risk Reduction work as well as other Save the Children members focusing on how children can be more involved throughout the DRR activities

Capacity building

- Develop the capacity of staff, partners, children and communities in child centred DRR and Climate Change Adaptation work
- Implement context specific DRR interventions with full participation of children and other stakeholders
- Provide technical training on how to reduce the impact of disasters such as drought management and climate change adaptation.

Programmatic support

- Support the local DRR officer to establish Child Centred DRR activities
- Conduct assessments to identify the risks facing target children and their coping strategies
- Initiate new ideas focusing on child centred DRR through conceptual and practical analysis of the subject relevant to the context.
- Assist communities in preparing action plans for implementing quality and timely DRR/CCA activities in coordination with other sector staff.
- Collaborate with Food Security and Livelihood Managers and network with other agencies to promote learning and resource mobilisation
- Ensure that lessons of child centred DRR are regularly documented and communicated to not only inform project planning and implementation but also enhance better understanding amongst other actors including donors
- Contribute to writing proposals related to DRR/CCA

 Proactively explore and develop opportunities for fundraising for Child Centred DRR related work and strategic co-operation for Save the Children Denmark's thematic main priorities (education, protection and Child Rights).

Monitoring and Evaluation

- With the support of the M&E manager put in place and operationalize a monitoring system where the project towards project results are tracked regularly
- Produce periodic reports on the DRR component of the project
