## National Awareness Campaign on "Safeguarding Environment for Disaster Risk Reduction" on the Eve of World Environment Day Date: 4<sup>th</sup> June 2014)

Environment and disasters are closely linked. Environmental changes particularly climate change, land-use changes and natural resource degradation is known to change the level of natural hazards and human vulnerability to disasters. With the recent reports of Inter-governmental Panel on Climate change (IPCC), activities of International Geosphere-Biosphere Programme (IGBP) and United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) has led to global awakening on integrating environment and disaster management which is well recognised within the Hyogo Framework of Action on Disaster Risk Reduction (HFA 2005-15). National Institute of Disaster Management. NIDM has been organizing campaigns for promoting awareness among all sections of society and Government for disaster prevention and effective emergency response. Looking to the need of the time, NIDM started national level campaigns on role of environmental awareness and conservation in reducing disaster risks and vulnerability of land and people.

On the eve of World Environment Day, National Institute of Disaster Management organised a awareness programme on "Safeguarding Environment for Disaster Reduction" at Scope Auditorium hall, Lodhi Road, New Delhi. More than 250 students, teachers and parents participated in the function besides academicians, policy makers, researchers, from International and United Nations Agencies, NGOs, educational Institutions, Ministries and Civil society groups participated in the programme.

This year, a national campaing was organised comprising essay completion for students (in Hindi and English) on "Safeguarding Environment for Disaster Reduction". More than 1500 entries were received from across the country representing more than 80 schools. Winners of the essay completion were given cash prizes today by Dr. B Bhattacharya, Member of National Disaster Management Authority, in the programme organized on the eve of World Environment Day at SCOPE Auditorium. First prize in Intermediate category of English essay was bagged by Piyush Kharbanda, where in Hindi Shreya Shailaan of Amity International School Delhi was selected for the prize, each of Rs. Ten Thousand. In the high school category Shubrojyoti Mookherjee of Delhi Public School Mathura received first prize in English and Priyanka Mahesh Chand of Guru Nanak Girls Senior Secondary School Delhi in Hindi. Total 32 students were given cash prizes covering first, second, third and five consolation prizes in each category
