CITIZEN EMPOWERMENT AND READYNESS, MONITORING OF DISASTERS, CLIMATE CHANGES AND CRISIS IMPACTS: THE APP SIGNALERT NOW AVAILABLE IN SPANISH FOR #COP21

Paris, Dec. 6 2015

Forest fires in Indonesia, Rockfall after earthquake in Nepal, Flash floods in the French Riviera are now being reported by users of the free crowdmapping smartphone app SIGNALERT. The organized descriptions of the events using the App are a much easier and reliable information to understand and assess the situations on the field than messages and pictures send through classical social medias which convey uncertainties and fake information, or are not always geocoded, making these data sometime difficult to interpret and validate.

The SIGNALERT free smartphone app for disasters and crisis crowdmapping is enlarging its users and it has become an important network worldwide. In 2015, the app was extended to **Cyclones**, **hurricanes and typhoons** impact description, completing the 6 others types of phenomenon's (floods, flash floods, wild fires, avalanches, snow falls, rock falls).

A Spanish version of the App is released during COP21 and (that) makes the app more accessible to the Latin-American countries and Spain, completing the existing English and French languages of the previous version.

New tools for you own security or to create local alert sharing network of users

The App is now offering a choice of emergency numbers worldwide and links to web site of national or international organizations forecasting or monitoring natural phenomenon's.




Travelling is becoming more risky with the increased climate extreme events, violence, pollution, which can be now encountered in areas still quite and safe a few years ago, SIGNALERT will introduce man-made disasters and crisis in a new version to be released early in 2016.

A **backpack emergency card** is proposed as a pdf form and can be filled off-line, printed and brought in your wallet during your trips, providing basic info's on how to assist you in case you would be hurt, wounded during a disaster. <u>The Backpack emergency card can</u> be downloaded here.

Local organized network of users can share and view the alerts about a neighbor event on their smartphone if the event occurs in a distance of less than 10 km. Shared information consist in a map showing location, nature and intensity of the event that you do not necessarily see from you place. Early warning on the progression of a flood can be announced between witnesses along a river this way. The information can be also forwarded to common social networks (Twitter, facebook). Tutorial videos are progressively uploaded on

Youtube to help groups forming such organized networks.
