## National Platforms – A definition

A nationally owned and led forum or committee of multistakeholders for Disaster risk reduction


As such National Platforms are mentioned in the **Hyogo Framework for Action's** Priority of Action 1 - Previously referred to in **UN Economic and Social Council Resolution** 1999/63 and 2005 **UN General Assembly resolution** A/RES/59/231

"The expression "national platform" is a generic term used for national mechanisms for coordination and policy guidance on disaster risk reduction that need to be multi-sectoral and interdisciplinary in nature, with public, private and civil society participation involving all concerned entities within a country. National platforms represent the national mechanism for the International Strategy for Disaster Reduction." (HFA, §16, 10)

- Ideally build on existing national coordinating mechanisms
- A multi-sectoral-, multi-stakeholder-, multi-level tool



# **Composition of National Platforms**





## **National Platform core functions**

- Serve as an advocate for DRR at different levels
- Increase national leadership and commitment to help the most vulnerable and at risk populations
- Increase levels of knowledge and skills on risk reduction
- Be a catalyst for national consultations and consensus building
- Provides **coordination**, **analysis and advice** on areas of priority requiring concerted action through a coordinated and participatory process among national stakeholders (e.g. to mainstreaming DRR into development policies, planning and programmes)
- Manage the progress towards achievement of DRR objectives rather than producing a « plan »,
- Monitors, evaluates and reports
- Through the HFA Focal point, serves as national focal point within the ISDR system and strengthens links with the UNISDR secretariat

**Increase national leadership and commitment** to the sustainability of disaster risk reduction and the implementation of the Hyogo Framework

## **Achievements by National Platforms (1)**

- Achieving **higher political commitment and engagement** of politicians for DRR (Costa Rica, Indonesia, Nigeria, Philippines, ...),
- Integrating DRR into national policy and legislation and development plans (China, Colombia, Djibouti, Kenya, Senegal, Uganda...),
- Mainstreaming DRR in line Ministries and rolling out of capacitydevelopment programmes and support to development of sectoral plans including DRR (Nigeria)
- Setting up sub-national DRM committees and promoting community participation in DRR through awareness-raising and capacity-building activities (China, Japan, Madagascar, Nicaragua, Switzerland, ...),
- Devising a system of **decentralized DRM based on the subsidiarity principle** involving multi-stakeholders at local, provincial and national level (Colombia),
- Engaging the **media**, **private sector and/or insurance sector** for DRR (Germany, Japan, Nigeria, Switzerland, ...)

# **Achievements by National Platforms (2)**

- Multi-stakeholder process to develop Road Map as Action Plan for DRR and definition of terms of references for National Platform (Sri Lanka)
- Joint development of a Contingency Plan for cyclone preparedness following the cluster approach, which substantially reduced number of otherwise expected casualties (Madagascar)
- Support to ISDR processes and initiatives at national, regional and international level through organization of events and conferences, support to the setting up of National Platforms in the region and globally, setting up of a network of National Platforms in Europe, contribution to European Commission green papers related to Disaster risk aspects defining the European Union approach both in Europe and in its development cooperation (Germany, France, Switzerland)
- Linking up with **climate change adaptation** focal points, contribute to UNFCCC processes, involvement in national adaptation policies and **climate risk management and adaptation pilot projects** (Germany, Sweden, Argentina, Ecuador)

# **UNISDR** secretariat support to National Platforms

- Promote and help establishing NPs and multi-stakeholder dialogue meetings (led by line-Ministry – implemented in support to/with UN RC)
- Organise/ contribute to global and regional thematic meetings and training with/ among National Platforms (e.g. Climate change and DRR workshops in Panama and in France, Mainstreaming workshop in Africa)
- Develop guidance documents, tools and contribution to ISDR partner work with NPs/ HFA FPs (incl. CCA/UNDAF guidelines, joint publications, etc.)
- Support sharing of NP experiences (« twinning » + good practices, « ISDR-Highlights « and other magazines)
- Jointly run awareness raising campaigns
- Undertake capacity assessments (with CADRI, UNDP)
- Support ministerial meetings in the regions
- Facilitate access to expertise www.preventionweb.net
- HFA monitor (progress reporting and information sharing)
