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

# 1. Objective (I)

- We propose a ten-year international effort in risk research to learn how to deal with risks that exceed current coping capacities.
- We will study risk occurrences as events in the dynamics of socio-ecological systems.
- We will focus on the entry transitions by which a given socio-ecological system switches into emergency or crisis mode, and the exit transitions by which the system switches back from emergency or crisis mode to a normal mode.





- We are especially interested in cases where the system switches back into a different normality than the one it hade before the crisis.
- We are particularly interested in systems in which the system's resilience increased after a switch back and future risks are reduced as a result of social learning.





- We aim at improving the governance of new risks that exceed current human coping capacities, by focusing on the transitions in and out of the occurrence of relevant risks.
- We are convinced that there is a need for new insights in the field of risk analysis, and that these insights will include conceptual and theoretical advances.
- We have the firm intention to orient our research on the practical needs of risk governance.





- Achieving advances in risk research by focusing on a specific phenomenon through a series of comparative case studies.
- Developing a research network with creative potential by emphasizing work in small groups based on guided self organization, and by consciously mixing people with very different backgrounds:
  - senior and young researchers
  - developing and developed countries
  - policy makers and practitioners
