Gaps in:



- Communicating the strategic issues linked to addressing the environmental dimensions of disaster reduction
- Resources for designing and implementing environmentally sound solutions to reducing the impact of disasters
- Mechanisms for adaptation to climate change and to respond to that change

IRP

Identified Needs

- Need to develop <u>methodologies and</u> tools to assess environmental impacts of disasters
- Need to <u>improve recovery planning</u> by taking into account environmental restoration
- Need to create a <u>stable recovery funding</u> (e.g. International Disaster Recovery Fund)



Reported Challenges

- Difficulties in assessing environmental impacts (e.g. Maldives & Kazakhstan)
- Issues in planning and coordination (e.g. Ecuador & China)
- Insufficient funding to forward recovery operations (e.g. Myanmar & Haiti)

Challenges linked to Environment

- Heavy pressure on timber cutting for reconstruction
- Unsustainable harvesting of medicinal plants
- Massive fuel wood cutting
- Uncontrolled grazing

Build Back Better than Before



Some Lessons

- Slope stabilization measures through fast growing species
- Environmental impact assessments for urban housing
- Indigenous designing and planning in harmony with local environment

Build Back Better than Before



Some Lessons (cont)

- Sensitization of local community for environment-friendly practices
- Participatory approaches in disaster reduction, involving the community, private sectors, NGOs, and line agencies
- Promotion of alternate fuel and construction materials to save the forests
