# PHILIPPINE DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

- RA 10121 Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of 2010
- National DRRM Framework end goal: safer, adaptive and disaster-resilient communities towards sustainable development
- National DRRM Plan 2011-2028 outlines programs, projects and activities covering the four thematic areas to strengthen capacity







### **REHABILITATION AND RECOVERY**



### Four Thematic Areas

#### **Disaster Preparedness**

Establish and strengthen capacities of communities to anticipate, cope and recover from the negative impacts of emergency occurrences and disasters

#### Disaster Response

Provide life preservation and meet the basic subsistence needs of affected population based on acceptable standards during or immediately after a disaster

#### Disaster Prevention and Mitigation

Avoid hazards and mitigate their potential impacts by reducing vulnerabilities and exposure and enhancing capacities of communities

Safer, adaptive and disaster resilient Filipino communities towards sustainable development

### Disaster Rehabilitation and Recovery

Restore and improve facilities, livelihood and living conditions and organizational capacities of affected communities, and reduced disaster risks in accordance with the "building back better" principle

#### Post Disaster Needs Assessment (PDNA)

#### **Background**

- Initially developed by the United Nations Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean (UNECLAC)
- Modified and enhanced by the World Bank in cooperation and consultation with other development part-
- Used extensively for the last 5 years internationally (Bangladesh, Indonesia, Philippines, among others)

- · Multi-sectoral and multi-disciplinary structured approach for ASSESSING DISASTER IMPACTS and PRIORITIZING RECOVERY and RECONSTRUCTION NEEDS
- · Undertaken by the government agencies also in collaboration with international development partners and the private sector

#### Methodologies

The PDNA REPORT is a result of the following methodologies:

- Sectoral experts using prescribed tables
- · Series of field visits and site inspections
- Focus Group Discussions (FGD)
- Quantitative analyses (objective)
- Qualitative analyses (subjective)
- Series of writeshops

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#### Post Disaster Needs Assessment (PDNA)

PDNA Team Composition

- PDNA teams are generally composed of professionals and technical experts from different agencies
- Composition depends on the type, scale and severity of the disaster and the sectors involved

- The short-term interventions to initiate recovery from the damages and losses
- · The financial requirements needed to achieve a holistic post-disaster recovery, reconstruction and risk management





#### Why PDNA should not be delayed?

- · There is an urgent need to seek support from the international community
- · The government must already have an overview of the funding and resources required for recovery and reconstruction
