MCR2030 City-to-City Learning Virtual Workshop between Sendai City and Ulaanbaatar City

Monday 6 November 2023

Background:

As part of the Making Cities Resilience (MCR2030) initiative, this workshop aims to contribute to urban resilience efforts in Mongolia and Japan by promoting experience sharing and learning from peer cities' activities and challenges in disaster risk reduction and mitigation.

In this workshop, government officials and disaster management experts from Ulaanbaatar City (Mongolia) and Sendai City (Japan) will discuss respective activities in disaster resilience, and share their respective efforts and challenges in disaster risk reduction. These presentations will be followed by discussions to exchange views and opinions among participants.

The following three themes will be presented and discussed in the workshop.

- Planning and Investment
 - DRR in urban planning, earthquake resistance and assessment, strengthening and retrofitting, building codes and norms
- Early Warning and Training
 - Evacuation, temporary shelters, early warning systems, simulation training and drills
 - Discussion: How can the city contribute to multi-hazard early warning systems or delivers early warnings to reduce the risk for its citizens? Are there any efficient ways to train citizens to prepare for disasters?
- Emergency Command Center Operations
 - Operation of city emergency command center, including number of staff, equipment, setup etc.

Workshop Objective:

This workshop aims to facilitate city-to-city experience sharing and peer-to-peer learning, and foster exchange of good practices between MCR2030 member cities in Japan and Mongolia.

Expected outcome:

- Experts from the two cities learn from each other's experience and from perspective examples of good practices in disaster risk reduction
- Collaboration between cities is strengthened

MCR2030 aims to ensure cities become inclusive, safe, resilient and sustainable by 2030, contributing directly to the achievement of Sustainable Development Goal 11 (SDG11) "Make cities and human settlements inclusive, safe, resilient and sustainable", and other global frameworks including the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction, the Paris Agreement and the New Urban Agenda.
